Since 1842 the Busatti family has been weaving in the cellars of the Palazzo Morgalanti in Anghiari, Tuscany.

This year, the expertise of eight generations of weavers arrives in your neighbourhood.



The first carding machines used by Busatti date back to the late 1700's when, after the French invasion, Napoleonic troops established a production facility for the uniforms of the "Grande Armée" in Anghiari. To dye the cloth blue, they cultivated Guado, a wood similar to indigo, known since early Florentine renaissance when Piero della Francesca used it in his frescoes.

The history of the company, always owned by the same family, is woven into the landscape of Anghiari like the Tuscan hills and valleys themselves. Busatti remains the choice of The Grand Duchy of Tuscany, the Garibaldi Family and many other household names. Miuccia Prada herself and several members of the Ferragamo family regularly buy our product for their own use.

Busatti is synonymous of quality, tradition and innovation. Virtually every product can be customized to one's specifications. Tablecloths, draperies, beddings, bath towels, kitchen accessories and much more can be made in any dimension and shape. Busatti even has the capacity, in some cases, to re-issue a special edition of an archival pattern to make it your own.
